Greetings from your Pinto Point Sewer District Board,

It's "lake season" and time to pay your annual sewer Maintenance & Operation fee. The 2010 financial statement on the back of this letter explains how your fee supports our sewer district. Please return the enclosed statement with your payment within 30 days to the *new* address indicated. Changes in your address or phone numbers should be noted in the space provided.

Repair expenses totaled \$2,375.00 last year, which was less than the previous year. Good job--keep up the good work! If we all comply with the maintenance, repair, and expansion/modification policies indicated on the back of the enclosed service call sheet, we can keep our repair expenses to a minimum.

In an effort to keep our sewer system in good working order, several board members and one awesome volunteer cut and hauled trees last summer that were growing over the drain field. Five septic tanks were also pumped, at a cost of \$1,575.00. We anticipate pumping another six tanks this summer. If your tank is one of them, a notice is enclosed with this statement. Please be advised that the by-laws of the sewer district prohibit trailers or RV's from connecting to the district's sewage system, either temporarily or permanently. Your guests should use the dump station at the entrance to Indian Creek Park.

Please post the enclosed service call information at the lake for your convenience in contacting a board member should your sewer light come on. Be sure to check the circuit breaker and replace the fuses before calling. It is a good idea to have replacement fuses on hand, as the local hardware store may not have them available. Please be advised that the sewer district will not pay for eligible service calls unless they are initiated by a board member.

We also suggest that you turn off the breaker to your water and sewer pumps during an extended absence from your cabin to prevent accidental burn out of your sewer pump should it turn on and continue to run while you are gone.

Finally, please be aware that continued usage of your sewer system—toilets, sinks, showers, laundry, etc.—during a power outage will result in a sewer backup. You are responsible for repairs to the sewer system as a result of usage during a power outage.
